Shuzi, good work.

Okay, now I realise what I have done.

I have downloaded the eReader software to my computer and PDA. So when I go to open one of the DOC files they save to my documents folder and open automatically in eReader. Much the same as it would with mobi files in mobi pocket. I suggest this is a viable option for anyone who uses a device that can use both mobi pocket and eReader.

I played around with other options too.

- 1.I downloaded the DOC version from PDAfiction.com and saved it to my documents file.
- 2.Used ABC amber to open DOC file then converted it to PDF and saved to my eBook documents folder. I used both PDF and MS Word to test this.
- 3.Used Mobipocket to Import file and convert to Mobi format then sent to my PDA.
- 4.Used Calibre to add and convert to sony reader format and sent it to my sony 505.

Of the files I converted, the font still looked like basic PDF but is still easy to read.

The layout was accurate with only one book having minor format errors, but was definately still readable.
